Report on the first project partners meeting in Gdańsk – Poland 18th - 22nd November 2009

EU LLP Grundtvig Learning Partnership: LET'S MIX UP C&I “LET'S MIX UP: CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION IN ADULT EDUCATION”

The first LET'S MIX UP C&I project partners meeting was held in Gdańsk in Cultural Park of City Fortifications “Gdańsk Fortress” from 18th - 22nd November 2009.

There were 4 participated in the project institutions present out of 5, together with its representatives:

The fifth institution from Austria – Vienna CULTURE CIRCLE KULTURBÜRO WIEN, was absent because of not having signed the contract yet.

5-day-meetings was carried out as follows :

▪ Wednesday, November 18th, 2009.

All participants arrived and checked-in in the accomodation place – Scandic Hotel

At 07:15 p.m. almost all participatns met by the reception (except Italy because of very late arrival) and went to Barbados Restaurant for a warm welcoming dinner.

▪ Thursday, November 19th, 2009

Participants met at 09:45 am.at the hotel and were leaded by the hosting institution representative to the the premies of Cultural Park of City Fortifications “Gdańsk Fortress”.

Afterwards the first session started, that was held by Arleta Pławska:

- Official welcoming to The Cultural Park of City Fortifications „Gdańsk Fortress“ Budgetary Unit of Gdańsk City Municipality - as a hosting institution
- General information about hosting institution, Hewelianum Centre and Hewelianum Programme and Johannes Hewelius
- Short description of the meeting programme
- Short description of the portfolio that was handed to all participants (the content of portfolio: Gdańsk meeting programme, exhibitions description, a science lesson scenario, a history lesson scenario, session feedback form x 2, a fact-sheet, a brochure, promotional material about Gdańsk).
- Technical information
- Self - introduction of participants
- describing the project progress, the success of the project – high position on European ranking list.
- Discussion and Brainstorming about convenient realisation of the project:
 - ✓ The reports will be prepared during each international meeting by hosting institutions,
 - ✓ the duration of the final film: about 5-10 minutes; Partner from Italy obliged themselves to verify if it’s a possibility to place the final DVD film on www.youtube ;
 - ✓ next project partners meeting in Spain: the most convenient airlines of getting to Almansa from each participating country and the date of the meeting was proposed on 9th – 12th March 2010.

After coffee break, at 11.30 am. the history lesson: “Time Machine – A Man and a Bullet” started as a presentation of good practice in history teaching. The lesson was presented by Lucyna Rokitiańska and the learners were all representatives of partner institutions and additionally a target group of the project in Poland – seniors with the age above 55+ (10 people).

The lesson was devoted to so called “Napoleonic era”, i.e. the beginning of the 19th century that gave Poland partial and short-time rebirth in form of the Free City of Gdańsk and the Duchy of Warsaw. During the lesson learners could listen to a short lecture, take part in a short quiz and attend the drill exercise together with the reconstruction group members who demonstrate the uniforms, the weapons of the Prussian army. Learners who took part in the drill (including shooting rifle) received diplomas confirming they have been trained at the Infanterie Regiment No 52 von Hamberger.

After lesson, all participating learners, visited a scientific-multimedia exposition “Time Machine – A Man and a Bullet”.

The lesson was recorded by cameraman in order to produce DVD from Polish presentation.

After lunch break, discussion and evaluation on the history lesson presentation was conducted (the results of session 1 feedback form is enclosed).

From 3.00 – 4.30 pm. guided tour carried out – participants visited part of Hewelianum Centre and the Fort Grodzisko area.

In the evening all participants went for a „Ice-breaking“ dinner to a typical Polish restaurant „Swojski Smak“.

▪ Friday, November 20th, 2009

Participants met at 10:00 on the premises of hosting institution and had next session.

Discussion and Brainstorming about convenient realisation of the project was continued.

The application form was analyzed in the context of project implementation. The project partners agreed that the process of project implementation is according to the work programme.

Juan Gil Saucedo – project coordinator from Spain – explained small changes in Spanish presentation during next partners meeting in Almansa.

Partners agreed on the possible dates of next meeting as follows:

- ✓ Almansa (Spain) - 9 – 12 March 2010 - will be officially confirmed.
- ✓ Vienna (Austria) – 5 – 9 July 2010 - will be consulted with Austrian partner during meeting in Almansa,
- ✓ Vilnius (Lithuania) – 6-10 December 2010.
- ✓ Rome (Italy) – 9-13 May 2011.

Partner from Spain agreed to send the information about the cost of accommodation in Almansa and to book the hotel for the next meeting participants.

Next, the discussion was held on the final product of the project: Arleta Pławska indicated a fact-sheet and a brochure that were a part of the portfolio as a products funded with a support of Grundtvig Programme in host institution. After that, she explained how the film from Polish presentation will be produced. The film from Polish presentation will be shown during meeting in Almansa.

Arleta Pławska also explained the engagement of seniors in the project, especially the way the host institution reached the target group (invitations sent to Third Age Universities in Tricity and information published on the website of Seniors Activity Centre).

After coffee break, at 11.30 am the physics and astronomy lesson: “Energy, Sky, The Sun” started as a presentation of good practice in science teaching. The lesson was presented by Krzysztof Ciesielski and the learners were all representatives of partner institutions and additionally a target group of the project in Poland – seniors with the age above 55+ (13 people). The lecturer invited learners to the journey to the centre of the Earth. Learners got to know the structure of our planet, properties of its strata and their influence on surface. Activities during the lesson were divided into two parts. The first one was the lecture based on projection. The second one was kept using exhibits of interactive exhibition “Energy, Sky and Sun”, especially with Magic Planet projector – the one device of such type not only in Poland but in whole Eastern Europe.

After lesson, all participating learners, visited a scientific-multimedia exposition “Energy, Sky and Sun”. The lesson was also recorded by cameraman in order to include the presentation on DVD.

After lunch break, discussion and evaluation on the physics and astronomy lesson presentation was conducted (the results of session 2 feedback form is enclosed).

From 4.00 – 7.00 pm. participants visited Sopot – the summer capital of Poland.

▪ Saturday, November 21st, 2009

Participants met at 09:30 in the front of accommodation place and had a cultural excursion – guided tour to the city of Gdańsk. Participants visited many interesting places and historical monuments, among them were : monument to the Fallen Shipyard Workers, St. Catherine's Church, St. Nicolas Church, St. Mary's Basilica, [St. Mary's Street](#), The Golden Gate, The Długa Street and the Długi Targ Street, The Neptune Fountain. During the excursion participants had a short coffee break in the old town.

The excursion finished 01.00 pm. and participants had a free time for lunch and shopping. Some of them stayed in Gdańsk and some of them went to Sopot again.

In the evening all participants (except Italy because of early departure) went for a farewell dinner to „Swojski Smak“ restaurant.
